THE BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (B.B.A.) IN ACCOUNTING

is a campus-based accelerated program for adults. Students learn the fundamentals of accounting practices, managerial accounting, cost accounting, federal taxation and are prepared for professional licensing examinations.

The Accounting curriculum also strives to enhance interpersonal communication, analytical thinking and problem-solving skills to prepare students for a lifetime of professional accomplishments and responsible citizenry.

With an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree and corresponding prerequisites*, students may earn the B.B.A. in Accounting in less than two years, along with an option for work/life experience credits. Students who complete the

program can earn a graduate degree with just 12-28 months of additional study in the Master of Science (M.S.) in Accountancy, M.S. in Taxation, M.S. in Business Analytics or Master of Business Administration programs.

Convenient evening learning teams begin in January, May and August if a minimum of 14 students are enrolled in the learning team. Students start the program in a group and attend class two nights each week (Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday) from 6:30-9:30 p.m. This allows for group cohesion along with the development of team-building and leadership skills. The fixed schedule allows adult students to plan in advance for personal and professional activities.

A joint B.B.A. in Finance or Business Analytics can be earned by completing six additional courses (18 semester credit hours) in just three additional terms.

Admissions Requirements

- Minimum 2.0/4.0 cumulative GPA
- Minimum age 22 years
- Minimum two years of work experience
- Minimum of 60 semester credit hours of transferable college credit is required and must include the following prerequisite courses completed with a grade of "C" or better:

Financial Accounting
