① Although you qualify for credit in Benedictine University's Elementary Spanish I & Elementary Spanish II, you may be interested in an alternative way of receiving credit if you plan on pursuing Spanish courses at Benedictine University. If you take the Spanish Language placement exam and place higher than Spanish 201, you may be able to receive 200-level credit instead of 100-level credit. If you do not plan on taking any additional Spanish courses at Benedictine University, credit for SPAN-101 and 102 can be awarded and it is not necessary to contact the Department of Languages and Literature. ② You need to satisfactorily complete both the Biology and Environmental Science exam to receive the ENVS 205 credit. Otherwise, you will receive biological science core elective credit for non-science majors (QLS).

③ Freshmen who test out of WRIT-101 are required to take WRIT-104, a one-credit-hour course in the Benedictine heritage. Credit is only awarded for one of English Lang/Comp and English Lit/Comp.

④ Not equivalent to a specific course but will count toward the hours needed to graduate.

To receive credit: Benedictine University must receive an official transcript from AP. For transcript: <https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/home>. **BU code: 1707** Advanced Placement credit is an external credit program. You must be registered for classes at Benedictine University and you will then be notified as to the process to have the credit posted onto your transcript. AP credit will appear on your transcript and once posted, credit cannot be unposted. A maximum of 30 credit hours earned through any combination of external credit programs may be applied with the approval of the University toward the 120 credit hours required for graduation. A nonrefundable posting fee of \$20 per exam will be charged to your account. See policy in University Catalog.
