THE BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (B.B.A.) IN ACCOUNTING is a campus-based

"fast-track" program for adults. Students learn the fundamentals of accounting practices, managerial accounting, cost accounting, federal taxation and are prepared for professional licensing examinations.

The accounting curriculum also strives to enhance interpersonal, communication, analytical thinking and problem-solving skills to prepare students for a lifetime of professional accomplishments and responsible citizenry.

With an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree and corresponding prerequisites*, students may earn the B.B.A. in Accounting in less than two years, along with an option for work/life and service learning credits. Students who

complete the program can earn a graduate degree with just 12-28 months of additional study in the Master of Science in Accountancy or Master of Business Administration programs.

Convenient evening learning teams begin in January, May and August. Students start the program in a group and attend class two nights each week. This allows for group cohesion along with the development of team-building and leadership skills. The fixed schedule allows adult students to plan in advance for personal and professional activities.

A joint B.B.A. in Finance can be earned by completing six additional courses (18 semester hours) in just three additional terms.

Entrance and Graduation Requirements

*A student must have earned at least 60 hours of transferable college credit and have taken prerequisite courses (MATH 105 or 110 and ACCT 111 and 112) to enter the program. Pre-advising may be required for some students.
