BENEDICTINE UNIVERSITY POLICE STAY ON CUTTING EDGE OF TRAINING



Benedictine University Police entered into an agreement with the Naperville Police Department to utilize their state-of-the-art firearms training facility.

University Police Officers now have access to carbine patrol rifles on campus. Officers train in various tactics and marksmanship techniques and have recently trained again with the Lisle Police Department for “Active Shooter” scenarios utilizing Lisle High School.

SPECIALIZED TRAINING



Officers were sent to several specialized schools this summer. Officer Don Baron has become a firearms instructor and patrol carbine instructor.

Officer Derek Ferguson has become a Cyber Crimes Investigator allowing the University Police to better investigate computer involved crimes.

SCHOLL EMERGENCY PHONES



Phase I of placing campus-wide emergency telephones in building common areas, has been completed in Scholl Hall. The Student Senate and University Police collaborated on this initiative, to install four telephones in the hallways at Scholl Hall. Signs posted next to the phones give specific instructions to contact the University Police in the event of an emergency. The phones can also be used to contact any University telephone extension for routine business. Phase II, will continue through the Fall semester and place additional phones in every building on campus.
