How should we evangelize? How do laity participate in the mission and apostolate of the Church? Since the Second Vatican Council, we have paid particular attention to the lay vocation within the Church but have somewhat neglected its call for the laity “to seek the kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and directing them according to God’s will.” This lecture covers what the call to evangelize means to lay Catholics in the documents of the Second Vatican Council, especially *Lumen Gentium*, *Gaudium et Spes* and *Apostolicam Actuositatem*, and explains their responsibilities for the New Evangelization.
